Going beyond system protection, ARvee provides dynamically configurable systems that enable users to restrict their access to information according to their own personal needs. Thus, security helps streamline applications to optimize personal productivity.

In addition to **application security**, ARvee has also provided applications to automate physical **facility security** such as the one shown on the reverse side for **Symbol Technologies**. This customized application logs and tracks visitors to the company, prints a bar coded badge that grants access to selected areas of the facility, and tracks personal assets carried by visitors. The application also tracks the company's own portable assets.
