**recognition** (rek'og nish'an) the act of recognizing or the state of being recognized; formal acknowledgement conveying approval or sanction; the acknowledgment by one government of the existence or independence of another government; the acknowledgement of something as valid or as entitled to consideration; friendly cognizance or attention; the acknowledgement or token appreciation of kindness, service, or merit; the perception of something identical with something previously known or in the mind; the perception of something as existing or true.

**recognizance** (ri.kog'nizans) an obligation agreed upon before a magistrate or court, wherein a particular act must be performed; the sum of money liable to forfeiture for nonperformance of such an obligation.

**recognize** know again, recognize, inspect; come to know or perceive to be identical with something previously known; to identify from knowledge of appearance or character; to perceive as existing or true; to acknowledge or treat as valid.

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**recourse** (re'kors) a going to, as for help or protection

**recover** (ri kuv'er) to regain after losing; to restore, as oneself, from sickness, faintness, or the like; to retrieve; to make up for; to reclaim for use, as resources or materials; to rescue; in some sports, to reclaim, as a position or advantage.

**recovery** (ri.kuv'e're) the act or power of regaining; restoration from sickness, faintness, or misfortune, obtaining the right to something by a verdict or judgment of a court.

**recreant** (ri'kuv'e.re) Treacherous; yielding to an enemy; cowardly; unfaithful; false.

**recreation** (rek're.a'shan) Amusement or diversion which gives enjoyment; refreshment of the strength and spirits, as after toil; anything providing entertainment or relaxation.

**recriminate** (ri.krim'i.nate) to answer one accusation with another; to charge an accuser with the like. To accuse in return. The act of recriminating; the response to one accusation with another; a counter-accusation, and accusation brought by the accused against the accuser upon the same fact.

**recrudescence** (re'kro.des') to break out afresh, as a sore or a disease that has been quiescent; to return to activity; reappear.

**recruit** (ri.krot') A newly enlisted soldier; a new member of an organization or group. To make up by enlistment; to supply with new men; to refresh; to renew, as the health, spirits, or strength. To enlist new soldiers; to gain health, spirits, or the like; to gain new supplies of anything wasted or needed

**rectifier** (rek'ti.fer) One who or that rectifies; one who or that which refines by repeated distillations; a device for obtaining
